6:35 PM: Meeting called to order by President Pamela Adams.

-Prayer was led by visiting Revered Ward.

6:36 PM: Officer Gibson (District 3)

-Provided a synopsis of the detailed crime report packet. Per usual the crime rate is low with a couple of exceptions.

-2 burglaries and 4 thefts have occurred within the past month.

-There are resources available to those looking to get rid of drugs. You can drop off drugs October 28, 2018 between 10AM and 2PM at District 3, District 4 or 4777 Kenard Avenue. All details are located in the crime stats packet.

-Mr. Dennis is concerned about the dumping that takes place at 1735 Pulte, the offender has been arrested.

-The Police Captain praised the low crime rate in the neighborhood.

-Two buildings on Denham will be knocked down.

6:51 PM: Motion on floor by Ms. Jacqueline to move nomination committee presentation after Jim Boyle's report. Motion did not pass, outvoted.

6:53 PM: Jim Boyle of CRC gave report of the center, opening hours and resources available to kids and adults.

-Pastor Ward with KUMA is having a coat drive for those in need October 13, 2018 from 2:30 PM to 4:30 PM.

7:00 PM: Cheryl Horne with the Public Defender's office gave presentation on the changing regulations to get your record expunged.

-Those who are eligible can have up to 5 felonies and unlimited misdemeanors.

- Beginning October 29, 2018 expungements begin, you can come down to the public defender's office every 1st and 3rd Wednesday of the month.

-Beginning November 2, 2018 there will be a 6 month amnesty for reinstatement fees for drivers with suspended licenses.

-Residents of Kentucky typically have higher fees to pay when trying to file for expungement.

7:50 PM: Ms. Jackson gave the treasury report.

-regular checking account: \$3,365 + \$55 from dues as of September 5, 2018.

-\$120 for website was spent.

-\$602.92 was spent by the President and Vice President on computer and electronic equipment for the community. All purchases were made at Best buy. This money was taken from NSP funds.

-Deducting the AIG money of \$782 we have a balance of \$1915.21.
